Attendance: Regular attendance is mandatory. If you are absent during the add period (the two weeks of the semester), you will be dropped and someone on the Wait List will be added. Homework: Homework will be assigned daily from the text but will be collected only on exam days. Other homework will be picked up and graded as stated on the problems. No late homework will be accepted! No exceptions! The lowest homework will be dropped.

Quizzes: Quizzes will be given as stated on the timetable. No make-ups will be given. Quizzes are given at the end of the class period. The lowest quiz grade will be dropped.

Exams: Three exams will be given as scheduled on the timetable. No make-ups will be given. If the final exam percentage is higher than the lowest exam percentage, it will replace the lowest exam percentage.

Final Exam: The final exam is comprehensive and will be given on the last day of class. Failure to take the final will result in an “F” for the course. If the final exam percentage is higher than the lowest exam percentage, it will replace the lowest exam percentage.

Labs: EXCEL will be used for at least 3 computer labs. Computer labs can be done in groups but individual labs must be turned in. Questions on the labs could appear on the final exam.

Study Techniques:

1. Chapter 1 is a very important chapter. Make sure that you read it carefully, reread it before Exam 1 and reread it again before the Final Exam.
2. Be on time for class. I will answer homework questions at the beginning of class.
3. Read the material that will be covered before class.
4. Do your homework like you would an exam or a quiz. Look for key words that tell you what to do for each problem – do not do your homework like you know what section it is in. Exams and quizzes will not tell you what section they are from.
5. Do your homework every night. Keep up on the work – do not get behind. You will not catch up.
6. Start a study group with some of your fellow students.
7. Bring your calculator to each class.
